Title: The Power of Agreement

Theme: Real Love in a Distracted World

Scripture: Ecclesiastes 4:9-12, Amos 3:3 (NIV)

Objective: During this session, the learner will examine how a shared effort yields better results and provides help during difficulties.

Training Text: Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 (NIV)

⁹ *Two are better than one,
because they have a good return for their labor:*

¹⁰ *If either of them falls down,
one can help the other up.*

*But pity anyone who falls
and has no one to help them up.*

¹¹ *Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm.
But how can one keep warm alone?*

¹² *Though one may be overpowered,
two can defend themselves.*

Scripture Discussion | Ecclesiastes 4:11-12

- What are the dangers of being alone and how does verse 11 encourage us to build and maintain strong relationships?
- What is the significance of the “cord of three strands?”

Scripture Discussion | Amos 3:3

- How do two people walk together?
- What does it mean to “walk together” with God?

Discussion Questions:

- How can we build supportive relationships in our families, churches and communities?

- What spiritual victories have you experienced through the power of relationships?

- In what way can you ensure that your life is in agreement with God’s will?
